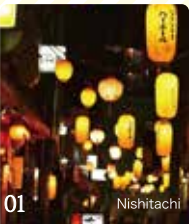

The striking corrugated rock surrounding Aoshima is called the "Devil's Washboard" because of its resemblance to a giant scrubbing board.

This small island of 1.5 km in circumference is teeming with sub-tropical plants and is surrounded by curious wave-shaped rock formations known as the "Devil's Washboard". The gods of traditional myths are enshrined at Aoshima Shrine (p.4), and with the Hyuga Ancient Myths Hall, (p.4), swimming beach, and sub-tropical botanical gardens, this area is a South Seas paradise. Nearby facilities include hot springs and accommodations.

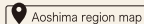

Located within the Citizen's Forest Park. Here, the deity Izanaki-no-mikoto, who had been chasing after Izanami-no-mikoto, fled to Misogi-ike from Yomi, the underworld, to purify himself.

Found within the grounds of Aoshima Shrine, the myth of Hyuga is explained with wax figures so that the story can be easily understood.



Inside Miyazaki Airport

Yumekagura, the marionette clock



The red color in the Kagura clock is the same as the color of the sun as it rises over the sea of the Hyuga-nada. The sepia and blue of the land and the washing board coast of Aoshima make the perfect base. Dolls from the local Hyuga legend of the cave of the sun god, Amano-Iwato appear from the clock once an hour. The Tajikaraonmikoto and Uzumenomikoto dolls perform the Kagura dance with the beat of the taiko drum.

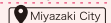


Tarumizu Park



Roughly 3,500 trees
A line of cherry trees about 1,000m long, commonly referred to as Cherry Road.

Miyazaki Central Park



A place to see cherry blossom in the middle of the city, close to Miyazaki Station.

Amagajo Park



Roughly 1,200 trees

During the Cherry Blossom Festival, the trees are illuminated at night creating a dreamlike atmosphere.

Roughly 400 trees

A popular spot close to the city, the park features a lookout with views across downtown Miyazaki.

The walking tracks and lookout are great for cherry blossom viewing, and the trees are also illuminated at night.

Miyazaki is well known as a food-lover's paradise. From cuisine with fresh seafood and ripe produce, to popular local snacks, Miyazaki has it all! In addition there are all kinds of lovingly crafted products and goods to catch your eye!

Chicken Nanban

One of Miyazaki's most popular foods. A crispy fried chicken cutlet is smothered in sweet sauce and then topped with tartar sauce.



Hiyajiru ("Chilled Soup")

This is a staple household dish in Miyazaki. Mackerel, sesame seeds, and miso are blended in a bowl then fried, then mixed into a cold soup with tofu, cucumber slices, and spices. This soup is poured over rice for a great summer treat. It really cools you down even on the hottest days.



Kama-age Udon ("Iron-pot noodles")

This hot, hearty dish is thick, freshly boiled noodles in a soy-sauce based soup topped with tempura and spices. It is well-known in Miyazaki as the perfect late night snack after a round of drinking.



Karamen Spicy Noodles

Featuring firm, springy noodles called konnyaku-men in a fiery red soup. This spicy soup has a particularly delicious flavor, unique to each restaurant. Once you've tasted it, you will keep coming back for more.



Sadowara Whale Sweets

It is said that the mother of Tadahisa, the 5th lord of Shimazu, wanted him to grow as big and strong as a whale, and so she created this playful sweet that looks like the giant sea creature.

Takaoka Naga Manju ("Long Sweet Dumpling")

This is a soft and chewy elongated dumpling snack. It is so popular in the area that all the local shops sell out by morning.

Cheese Manju Dumpling

Popularized by being a favorite of flight attendants, this cream cheese filled cookie born in Miyazaki has become famous nationwide.

Shochu (Distilled spirits)

Miyazaki's Shochu liquor comes in rich range, including sweet potato, rice and barley. These masterpieces are created by the distiller's art and the bounty of nature.



Miyazaki Beef

Miyazaki beef has won two consecutive top beef in Japan titles at the National Competitive Exhibition of Wagyu. The beef is sweet and soft. Locals are very proud of it being the best quality beef in Japan.



Miyazaki "Jitokko" Chicken

This prized bird's meat has a unique juicy tenderness. As they are few in number and hard to procure, the Jitokko has been nicknamed the "ghost chicken".

Lettuce Rolls

Succulent shrimp and crispy lettuce are wrapped up with mayonnaise into a sushi roll. Very popular with children.



Unagi (Eel)

Miyazaki is 3rd in the nation for farm-raised eel production. The eels of Sadowara in Miyazaki City are well-known throughout the country for their tenderness and rich taste.



Niku-maki Onigiri ("Meat-wrapped rice balls")

A local specialty: pork strips marinated in a secret sauce; wrapped around rice balls and roasted in the oven.



Aoshima Spiny Lobster

Spiny Lobster fishing season is in the fall and winter, and fresh, lively, delicious spiny lobster can be had straight from the waters of Hyuga.



Nan-o-saru

These bells made of sago palm seeds are said to keep the carrier safe from trouble.

"Aoshima Bina" dolls

These are cute dolls made from traditional Japanese paper. It is common practice to use these dolls as charms for finding true love or for good health.



Hisamine Uzura Guruma ("wheeled quails")

In the Tokugawa Era, quail hunting with nets was a popular activity. These toys arose from that culture and are still enjoyed by children today.



Sadowara Dolls

It is said that Koreans began making pottery here in ancient times, and ceramics have long been prized as gifts.

Miyazaki Resort Hot Spring "Tamayura no Yu" is a natural hot spring alongside Oyodo Kahan Tachibana Park, and its waters bubble up from the Earth at 45.6 °C.

**Aoshima Hot Spring

This hot spring is located near the tourist area of Aoshima. The location is excellent, and there is a spectacular view of the seas of Hyuga from almost anywhere in the facility.

**Takaoka Hot Springs
"Yasuragi no sato"**  A-3

This hot spring is in the green forests of the Takaoka region. In the summer, fireflies dance in the clear waters that run through this area.

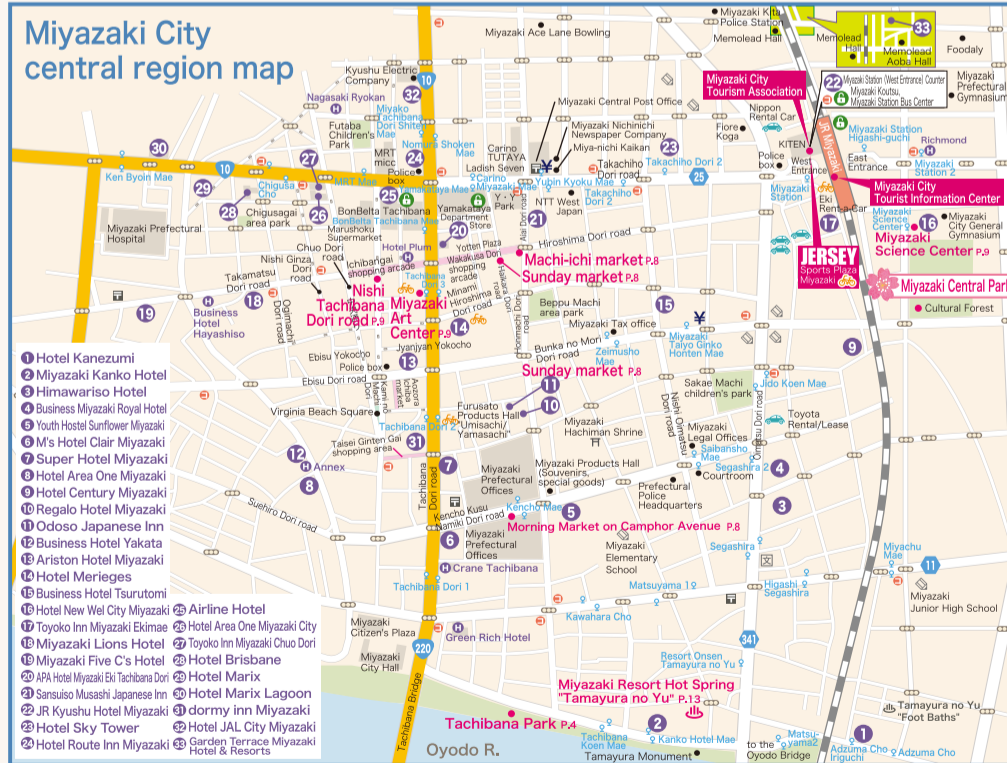
